



- ⇒ Providing adequate supply of white Canes and mobility devices,
- ⇒ Providing Braille Machines and ensure they are maintained,
- ⇒ Providing adequate supply of Braille Papers,
- ⇒ Ensuring availability of adequate learning material in accessible formats and
- ⇒ Providing Universal Braille kits
- ⇒ Training Braille Transcribers and school-based Technicians on repair and maintenance of Braille equipment

A total of 68 students went for the mountain climb representing Oshwal Academy Nairobi, Senior High. They had an opportunity to interact with their peers from other school and also assist the visually impaired persons climb the mountain. President's Award Scheme is a program that helps young people develop character and life skills to become responsible citizens. The program is open to young people of ages 14–24, regardless of background, culture, physical ability, skills, or interests. To participate, preliminary training is necessary to equip the participants for the program. On 18th September, 2024, Oshwal Academy Nairobi Senior High invited external assessors from President's Award- Kenya to guide students on Navigation (Physical map reading and compass interpretation) where coordinates were given to students in their respective groups to interpret from the map and route planning. #### BTEC ART AND DESIGN TRIP TO NAIROBI GALLERY ON 26/09/2024

BTEC Art and Design students embarked on an enriching trip to the Nairobi Gallery, renowned for its Murumbi African Heritage Collection and contemporary art exhibits. This visit was not only an opportunity to explore significant artistic works but also a vital component of Unit B1: Personal Progression, which emphasizes the importance of experiential learning and personal development in the arts.

The Murumbi African Heritage Collection is a remarkable assemblage of artifacts, textiles, and artworks that celebrate Africa's rich cultural diversity. As students navigated through the gallery, they encountered various pieces that reflect the historical and social narratives of African heritage. This collection serves as a testament to the importance of preserving cultural identity and understanding the past, which aligns with our curriculum's focus on the historical context of art.

Students engaged in discussions about the significance of the artifact's, analyzing their cultural relevance and the stories they tell. This experience encouraged them to think critically about the role of art in society and its power to convey messages across generations.

In addition to the heritage collection, the gallery showcased a variety of contemporary artworks by both local and international artists. This exposure to modern artistic expressions allowed students to draw connections between traditional and contemporary practices. They observed how contemporary artists address current social issues, reflecting on themes such as identity, migration, and globalization.

The interactive nature of the exhibits encouraged students to engage creatively, prompting them to consider how they might incorporate similar themes into their own work.









#### FIRST AID TRAINING BY ST JOHN'S AMBULANCE

First aid training is important as it leads to acquisition of skills on how to respond to emergencies and provide immediate care until professional help arrives. On Saturday, 28th September 2024, St. John's Ambulance conducted a comprehensive First Aid training session for students. This was organized by the first aid club of senior high. The training was aimed at equipping participants with essential first aid skills, which are vital for handling emergencies both in the school environment and beyond.

Students gained basic first aid knowledge which enhanced their preparedness to handle an emergency. Students also had a chance to engage in hands-on Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) demonstrations led by the certified trainers from St John's Ambulance. Each student was guided through the proper techniques of chest compressions.

The training also focused on risk assessment in emergency situations meant to quickly assess the safety of the scene and identify potential hazards before commencing to offer first aid services. The training was highly engaging, combining practical exercises and real-life scenarios, keeping students actively involved throughout the session. By the end of the session, students expressed increased confidence in their ability to respond to emergencies. Congratulations to the trained first aiders, the skills go along in offering of humanitarian services.









#### **EAMUN**

On October 18, 2024, at 8:10 AM, we departed for a tour of the United Nations Headquarters in Nairobi, Kenya, focusing on sustainability, green technology, and the UN's history. Our tour guide, provided an insightful overview of the UN's history, the significance of the 195 flags, and led us through the UNEP and UN Habitat spaces, emphasising the role of green technology in promoting sustainability.

The students also learnt more about the United Nations Office at Nairobi (UNON), which facilitates cooperation between the UN and regional organizations, manages conference services, and ensures the safety of staff and facilities.

During the visit, students observed two meaningful sculptures: one of a forefinger donated by Government of Chile, symbolizing unity and the power of individual action, and another of a spoon donated by Government of India, representing nourishment and cooperation. Additionally, the tour guide shared a powerful photo painted by school going children depicting a journey on sustainability, highlighting the UN's commitment to environmental management and peace building.

Students were also taken into one of the conference rooms, where they simulated a UN session, with two of the students volunteering as ambassadors and presenting resolutions. This hands-on activity enhanced their understanding of global diplomacy.

Overall, the UN educational trip has enhanced the students' understanding of sustainability, international cooperation, and the role of the UN in promoting foster peace and sustainable development.

#### BTEC ART AND DESIGN BRANDING TALK HELD ON 4<sup>TH</sup> OCTOBER, 2024 AT THE ART STUDIO

The BTEC Art and Design students had the privilege of attending an insightful talk on branding, delivered by Ms. Maureen Khaoya, a graphic designer and communications expert. This session was particularly relevant to one of their core units: Unit B1: Personal Progression. The talk provided students with valuable insights into the importance of branding in their artistic careers. ### BTEC SPORT TALK ON INFLUENCE OF TECHNOLOGY ON SPORTS HELD ON $15^{\text{TH}}\,$ OCTOBER, 2024

The session focused on the evolving role of technology in modern sports and its impact on both athletes and sports management. Additionally, the speaker highlighted on the relationship between sports and business, offering students a well-rounded perspective on how these areas intersect in today's professional sports industry. The talk explored how technology has revolutionized various aspects of sports, including athlete performance, sports training, event management, and fan engagement. The speaker provided real-world examples of how cutting-edge technology is being utilized in different sports to improve efficiency, accuracy, and the overall experience for both players and spectators. The session also dived into the business side of sports, examining how technology helps drive revenue, sponsorships, and brand value in professional sporting organizations.

The speaker discussed how tools like wearable technology, GPS trackers, and performance analysis software are increasingly used to monitor athletes' health, fitness levels, and in-game performance. Devices that track heart rate, body temperature, and physical output allow for personalized training plans and injury prevention, enhancing athletes' longevity in their sports. Virtual reality (VR) and augmented reality (AR) were highlighted as emerging tools in training athletes. The role of data analytics in managing sports teams and events andhow mobile apps, social media, and streaming services have increased fan engagement, enabling supporters to follow games in real-time, purchase tickets, and interact with content from anywhere in the world was alo explained. It was a realization that with the rise of digital platforms, teams and athletes can now market themselves directly to global audiences. The talk provided a comprehensive look at how technology continues to influence and shape the sports industry, from enhancing athlete performance and training to revolutionizing sports management and fan interaction. The insights into the business side of sports further highlighted how technology creates new opportunities for revenue generation and global reach. Students left the session with a deeper understanding of how sports and technology intersect, and many were inspired to explore these trends further in their own career paths in sports management and business.


