From historical masterpieces to contemporary abstract art, there was something to pique the interest of every student.





Many universities also provided interactive activities and demonstrations to give students a hands-on experience of what it's like to study in their programs. Overall, the fair was a valuable experience for students, helping them gain insight into the diverse range of options available to them after they complete their secondary education.









#### UNIVERSITY OF DUNDEE INTERNATIONAL MOOT COMPETITION

The 2024 Internal Moot Competition was organized by the University of Dundee (UK) for the benefit of law students worldwide. The Competition invited teams from schools around the world to prepare written submissions and present oral arguments on each side of a hypothetical law problem set by experts in the field.

#### 2024 LAW INSET

Teachers are lifelong learners. This is why INSETS are developed. Oshwal Academy Nairobi prioritizes professional development of teachers. A Law INSET was held on 6th Feb 2024. There were five participants representing schools from KAIS in Kenya.

The Oshwal Academy Nairobi, Senior High Management Staff welcomed the participants and emphasized the importance of the event. The Coordinator, Ms Mary adopted an open discussion approach to the five agenda items where all participants spoke and expressed their opinions. Varios topics were discussed that included:

LAW CURRICULUM, discussions focused on the deficient areas of the curriculum and how to address the gaps. The consensus is that, there is need to use marking schemes as a method of supplementing gaps in the syllabus.

Examinations; focused on the previous general performances and 2024 preparations.

Though performances in previous exams were fair, participants urged caution to the incoming 2024 in the wake of a higher grade thresh-hold in the subject coupled with a more stringent marking post COVID. The Change of exam format to short answer questions and an increased number of compulsory questions meant that the passing odds have become leaner and hence the need for an adequate revision strategy.

Class Management; participants recognized the need for a strategy to organize teaching space which may involve class rules, institutional rules and sitting arrangements. However, there is no one fit all Class management strategies, each teacher must tailor the working methods based upon class's needs, attitudes and other factors.

Technology And Teaching; discussions centered on the need to embrace technology in learning. Despite the good reasons of using certain tools and devices in classrooms, questions are being asked for example whether and what extent to allow technology in learning. Nevertheless, the consensus is that, "technology tamed" is capable of adding value to learning.

Effective Teaching Techniques; discussions explored teaching practices that teachers can employ in order to enable student learning. Participants were of the view that, here is no one fit all method.

Oshwal Academy Nairobi, Senior High had 9 students who participated in the challenge in two teams. The time line for finishing the task was from September 2023 to January 2024.

One of our teams got qualified into the final round where they competed with students from 7 other international schools in Kenya. The theme chosen by our qualified team was the **usage of a robotic arm in the medical field.** This group of 5 students under the guidance of teachers in the Physics department came up with their research findings and a working model of a Robotic arm which they themselves coded and assembled. The final presentation and judging by a panel of judges that includes Professors from Porstmouth University itself was conducted on the 14<sup>th</sup> of February in BrookHouse School, Karen. 


